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## Alaska Gasline Development Corporation Opens Nikiski Office

**February 8, 2018 – Anchorage, Alaska** – The Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) today announced the imminent opening of a satellite office in Nikiski, Alaska. The office will be staffed by longtime Kenai Peninsula resident, Debra Holle Brown.

Nikiski is the site of AGDC's planned Alaska LNG liquefaction plant and export terminal that will be supplied by Alaska's long-awaited gasline from the North Slope. The facility will produce and export up to 20 million tonnes of LNG annually to customers across the Asia-Pacific region and provide LNG for intrastate distribution. The gasline will have additional capacity to supply more than double the entire existing gas demand in Alaska.

Ms. Brown is a deep-rooted resident with decades of experience in project management, public service, and fisheries. Most recently, Ms. Brown served as special assistant to the Commissioner of Alaska's Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. She is also a former Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) Assembly member, KPB Economic Development District President, KPB Planning Commissioner, and KPB School Board member.

"As Alaska LNG advances toward construction, it's critical that AGDC be accessible to Alaskans," said Keith Meyer, president, AGDC. "Alaska LNG will have a positive economic impact across the entire state. Nikiski, which gave birth to the Asia-Pacific LNG trade nearly 50 years ago, will see a new level of activity and economic prosperity with a state of the art LNG production facility that will easily have another 50 years of life. As the world embraces liquefied natural gas as a clean fuel, Nikiski can be proud of its place in LNG history and AGDC is proud to be a growing part of the Nikiski community."

"Alaska LNG is going to be a long-term economic boom for Nikiski and the entire Kenai Peninsula," said Ms. Brown, community affairs representative, AGDC. "I am sincerely honored to work with AGDC to represent my friends and neighbors throughout the construction phase of this exciting project."

Alaska LNG is an integrated gas infrastructure project with three major components: a gas treatment plant located at Prudhoe Bay, an 807-mile pipeline to Southcentral Alaska with offtakes for in-state use, and a natural gas liquefaction facility in Nikiski to produce liquefied natural gas (LNG) for export.

AGDC's Nikiski office is located within the Nikiski Recreation Center at 50097 Kenai Spur Highway, Kenai, Alaska 99611. The office will be open daily, Monday through Friday, starting February 12, 2018.

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The Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) is an independent, public corporation of the State of Alaska.
